
5. **CLEAVING FOR 250 MICRON AND OPTISNAP® FANOUT APPLICATIONS**

Step 1: Add handler track to cleaver.


a. Remove 900/2.9 handler.



c. Insert handler track.




Step 2: Strip fiber and check length against guide.

For furcation when using a 250 micron OptiSnap connector (-250 connector part numbers), load fiber into purple OptiSnap fanout handler.

For 250 micron bare fiber installation only using 250 micron OptiSnap connector (-250 connector part numbers), load fiber into gray (or orange) OptiSnap handler.

For furcation using 900 micron OptiSnap connectors (-900 connector part numbers), load fiber into blue OptiSnap fanout handler (ordered separately, p/n HAN-FANOUT-UNI).




6. TROUBLESHOOTING

	2. Blade is worn or damaged.	2. Replace the blade per the instructions.


7. MAINTENANCE

To open depress latch and lift cover.









7.2. Cleaning

Wipe three places with fiber wipes and cleaning fluid. Aggressively clean scrap pad if experiencing fiber breaks.




7.3. Replacing Blade
