**NOTICE OF FINAL INITIAL DETERMINATION ON VIOLATION OF SECTION 337**

(July 23, 2026)

On this date, the undersigned issued an initial determination on violation of section 337 in the above-captioned matter.<sup>1</sup> For the reasons discussed therein, it is the undersigned's final initial determination that there has been a violation of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended, 19 U.S.C. § 1337, by each of the remaining Respondents, in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and/or the sale within the United States after importation of glass substrates for liquid crystal displays, display panels containing the same, which are TVs, monitors, notebook and laptop computers, and tablets, or in the sale of such products by the owner, importer, or consignee, by reason of misappropriation of trade secrets, the threat or effect of which is to destroy or substantially injure an industry in the United States.

Pursuant to Commission Rule 210.42(a)(1)(ii), a recommended determination on remedy, bonding, and the public interest will issue within 14 days of this initial determination. 19 C.F.R. § 210.42(a)(1)(ii).
